The SRC play an important role in making sure that we know that all have responsibilities and rights including the right to be safe.

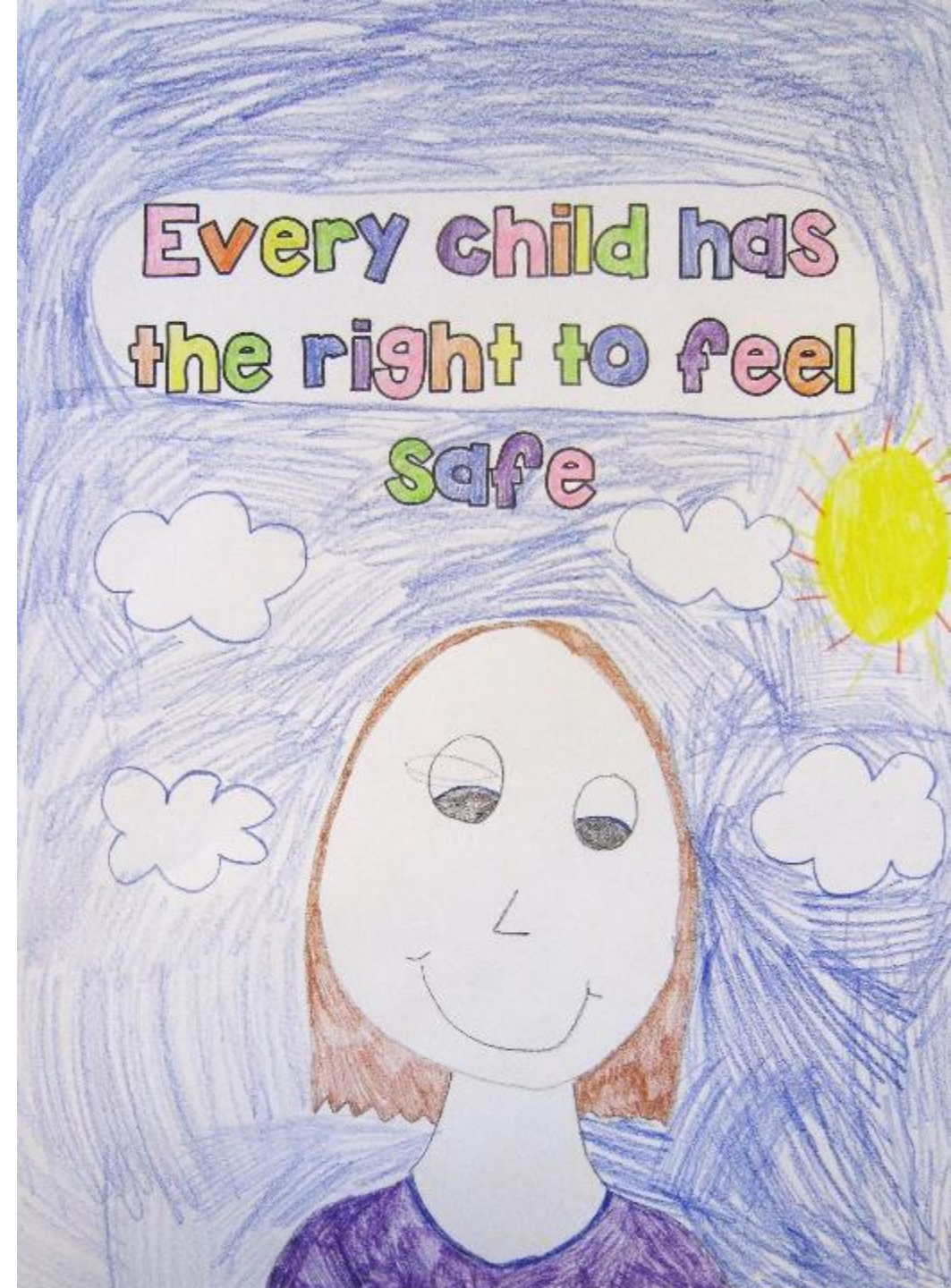
Classroom activities, like circle time helps us to understand our rights and provide support.

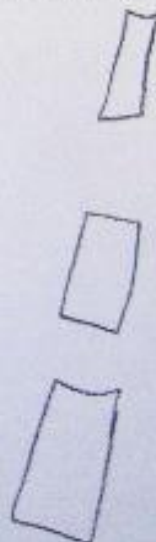
